Charging and Remission policy

WRAGBY PRIMARY SCHOOL CHARGING AND REMISSION POLICY

The Governing Body of Wragby Primary School recognises the valuable contribution that the wide range of additional activities, including trips, clubs and residential experiences can make towards pupils' education. The Governing Body aims to promote and provide such activities both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum for the pupils of the school and as additional optional activities.

CHARGES

The governing body reserves the right to make a charge in the following circumstances for activities organised by the school:

- **School Journeys in School Hours**
The board and lodging element of approved residential activities deemed to take place in school hours.
- **Activities outside School Hours**
The full cost to each pupil of all approved activities deemed to be optional extras taking place outside school hours.
- **Individual Instrumental Tuition**
The cost (or part of the cost) to the pupil for providing any instrumental tuition requested by parents and provided through qualified music specialists.

GENERAL

The Governing Body may from time to time, amend the categories of activity for which a charge may be made. Nothing in this policy statement precludes the Governing Body from inviting parents to make a Voluntary Contribution towards the cost of additional activities, which take place in school time. Parents may be advised that the continuance of an activity may depend upon voluntary contributions, but once it has been decided to run such an activity no qualifying child will be excluded on the grounds of voluntary contributions.

REMISSIONS

The Governing Body may wish to remit in full or in part the cost of some activities for particular groups of parents, for example, in the case of family hardship. When arranging a chargeable activity such parents will be invited in confidence for the remission of charges in full or in part. Authorisation for such remission will be made by the Headteacher in consultation with the Chair of Governors.
